Samuel Abloeser concentrates his practice in litigation. In personal injury cases, he has represented individuals who have sustained serious injury in motor vehicle accidents, as a result of medical negligence, and due to defective products. He has represented workers who sustained injury as a result of exposure to asbestos as well as women diagnosed with breast cancer after Hormone Replacement Therapy. Mr. Abloeser has also represented hundreds of railroad workers who were injured while on the job. These workers are subject to the Federal Employers' Liability Act.

In the field of commercial litigation, Mr. Abloeser represents small business and closely held corporations. His clients have included a ship supply corporation involved in litigation with France and Turkey, and a cell phone distributor involved in litigation with Cingular/AT&T. His work on behalf of the ship supply corporation involved international maritime law, the Jones Act, and international ship seizures.
